Park & Sports Complex Facility Rules



NMBP&R Staff or designee reserves the right to dismiss any patron, spectator, player, coach or team who is in violation of the City of North Myrtle Beach regulations, ordinances and/or facility rules. The following is prohibited at North Myrtle Beach facilities.

- Pets, other than documented service animals inside the athletic complex.
- Personal coolers are not allowed inside the athletic complex. 1 team cooler is allowed per team in the dugout/player bench.
- Alcoholic beverages or the use of tobacco products of any kind. Our park is smoke free.
- The use of metal cleats inside the batting cages and on pitching mounds.
- Parking is only allowed in designated areas, vehicles cannot park on grass or sidewalks. All trailers must be detached and parked in one space and cannot be left over night.
- Weapons or firearms.
- Profanity.
- Disruptive behavior.
- Artificial noise makers.
- The use of drones, model airplanes, or any other unmanned aerial vehicle.
- Soliciting.
- Soft-toss or “pepper” against fences or structures.
- Warm-up in places other than the designated areas for warm-ups.
- The use of bicycles, skateboards, scooters, or any other wheeled recreational device or apparatus within the athletic complex
- Non-compliance with posted warning and regulatory signs.
- The use of unauthorized vehicles inside park gates.
- Unauthorized personnel in scoring booths, meeting rooms, or other areas of the facility.
- Children under 12 years of age who are not accompanied by an adult.
- Placement of personal tents and other shade devices in unauthorized areas.
- In instances of inclement weather, all park patrons must abide by facility procedures for inclement weather.
- Weatherbug Information (Lightning Detection System):
 - Weatherbug is a system that is designed for the detection and protection against lightning strikes. The system is located on top of the main concessions stand at the North Myrtle Beach Park and Sports Complex. Weatherbug works by releasing 1 long blast and a light comes on when the system detects lightning near the complex. Once the blast is made, everyone will be directed to go to their vehicle to wait for safe conditions. Safe conditions are defined as 30 minutes after the last lightning strike and will be signaled by 3 short blasts and the light will go out. Once the blasts are heard, people may return to the complex. Abiding by the system is mandatory.
